

KARUIZAWA TALIESIN located at the side of Shiozawa Lake, where you can discover three museums and a variety of recreation facilities in the abundant nature and fresh air for a background.

TALIESIN means “The shining forehead” in Welsh and it's also a 19th century wandering minstrel's name from Wales who sang the praises of art. The architect, Frank Lloyd Wright, known as a designer of the former Imperial Hotel, is said to have named his own studio as Taliesin, built upon a hill at Spring green in Wisconsin US, in order to pursue the ideal land of art.

We have also named this park TALIESIN as Wright.



Wright had done in hopes that the culture originating from Karuizawa could be maintained and further developed.

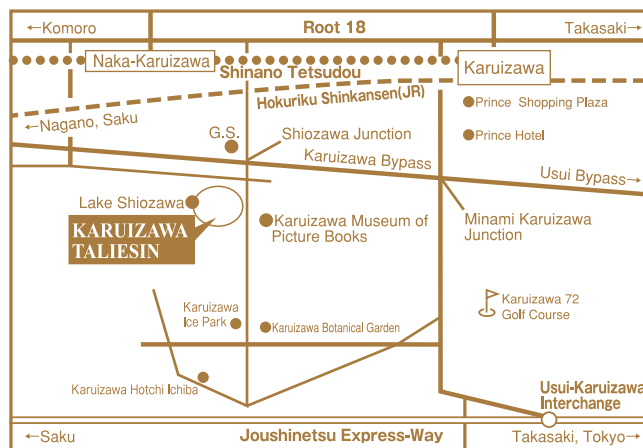

# KARUIZAWA TALIESIN

## ① Musée PEYNET

On display are original paintings, lithographs and the personal painting tools of Raymond Peynet whose series of "Lovers of Peynet" are well known throughout the world. When the museum opened in 1986 his painting "Lovers" was exhibited as well.

## ② The Summer House

Built by Antonine Raymond at Karuizawa as a studio and summer house in 1933. He had visited Japan as a staff member of F.L.Wright, wellknown for his architecture of the former Imperial Hotel. The house was transferred to the lakeside of Shiozawa in 1986 and modified into Musée PEYNET

## ③ "Suikyuso", the mountain villa of Asabuki

Tomiko Asabuki, the novelist who had translated French literature such as Fracoise Sagan and Simone de Beauvoir into Japanese, had spent summer in this villa. W.M. Vories designed this villa and it was built at Kyu-Karuizawa in 1931.



## ④ The Literary Museum of Karuizawa

Opened in 1985. Exposition of manuscripts, letters and first editions of books, personal collections of books and stationery of literary men deeply connected with Karuizawa such as Tatu Hori, Saisei Muroo, Michizo Tachihara, Ryunosuke Akutagawa and Yasunari Kawabata

## ⑤ The mountain villa of Tatsuo Hori

The villa once was the mountain villa of an American Mr. Smith built near Kamanosawa of Kyu-karuizawa and also described in the novel "Utsukushii Mura (A beautiful village)". Purchased in 1942. Hori stayed from the beginning of summer until autumn every year up to 1944.



## ⑥ "Johgetsuan, the villa of Takeo Arishima

The villa, built by Takeshi Arishima, father of Takeo, at Mikasa in kyu-karuizawa, was used for summering. Takeo Arishima had spent every summer in this villa since 1925 and wrote a part of "Umareizuru Nayami (The agony of coming into the world)" here.

## ⑦ The study of Yaeko Nogami

The study and the tea arbor built at Daigaku village, Kita-karuizawa (Naganohara-machi, Gunma Pref. presently) in 1933. The appearance is classical



## ⑧ Meiji Yonjuyonen-kan Mansion

The European style two-storied wooden house originally built at Kyu-karuizawa and was transferred to Taliesin. People used to gather in front of this house, which used to be one of the most well-known places of Karuizawa, for exchanges of infomation.



## ⑨ Kouko Fukazawa Nonohana Flower Museum

Kouko Fukazawa had deeply loved wild flowers throughout her life and consistently drew them. At this museum, on display are original paintings such as "Wild flowers" by Kouko Fukazawa had close friendships with Karuizawa-based literary men.



## ⑱ Shunsai Pasta Restaurant Sonnet

Italian cuisine restaurant at Meiji Yonjuyonen-kan Mansion.

## ⑳ Restaurant Kosui

Cafeteria style restaurant at the lakeside



## ⑩ English Rose Garden

A rose garden full of approximately 1800 English rose blossoms. These roses were cultivated by David Austin, an English culturist in order to attract visitors through strong rare fragrances and vivid beauty.
